The list of items for this kit will help you to be more prepared for emergencies whilst on out and about on the road. The items in this kit address such emergencies as flat tyres to road accidents. Whether you're driving out on the main road or off the beaten track this list applies to everyone.

Here is a list of what we believe should be in every vehicle in Australia:

- Get Home Bag (see our article on Practical Everyday Carry Gear)
- Bottled water for 72 hrs
- MRE ration packs and protein and energy bars for 72 hrs
- Floodlight
- Jump starter cables
- Motor Oil
- Hydraulic Jack rated for vehicle weight
- Tyre iron
- Heavy Duty Leather Work Gloves
- Basic vehicle parts kit (if applicable)
- Spare Fuses
- Tarp
- Toolkit (screwdrivers, wrenches, spanners, bolt cutters, stilsons, tin snips, hammer)
- Pry or wrecking bar
- Hooligan tool (optional)
- Fire Extinguisher (for firefighting)
- 20 L Knapsack (grass firefighting purposes)
- Remote Area First Aid Kit
- Reflective Vest (helps you to be visible whilst working on your vehicle)
- Reflective Triangles or traffic cones (redirect traffic around your broken down vehicle or accident scene)
- Shovel
- Recovery straps
- Glass puncher (such as the Resqme)
- Wool Blankets
- Bivvy sacks
- Wet Weather Gear
- Sunscreen
- Mobile UHF CB Radio
- 20 L of vehicle fuel
- Coat Hanger (for the inevitable lockout)
- Small container of fine sand or kitty litter (for absorbing vehicle fuel leaks)
